



The Little Bridesmaid Laveta Pamela Rianas Tiffa N. Tanuwigena






Rena and her parents are attending Teta Yusni's wedding party. Teta Yusni is Rena's older cousin. Rena's distant relatives from faraway places are also here.

"Really? I can?" Rena is surprised.


"Sure. A bridesmaid is called *anak daro ketek* here. Do you want to be one?" Teta asks again. Of course Rena wants to be one!

Now it's Rena's turn to get makeup on. Then Rena is ready for the bridesmaid's dress. But the dress does not fit her!



"Hmm...this dress really looks too small on you. You'd better wear another dress, Rena," her mom says.




